SUMMER BUS TOURS

Friday July 8th - A Blast from the Past!

Visit the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum and experience a 360-million-year journey, from Palaeo to Petroleum! Next up is Saskatoon Island Provincial Park, a short ride down the road from the museum where you can enjoy your lunch at the picnic tables. Keep an eye out for the Trumpeter Swans that can be spotted on the lake.

Friday July 15th - Mile 0 Mackenzie Highway, Grimshaw

Head North to the Town of Grimshaw for the day! Grimshaw is home to some of the most diverse and welcoming businesses in the area. Stop by The Bakers Collab for a tasty treat, check-out the latest trends at Almyra's Fashion for Ladies, smell the fresh-cut flowers at Raediance Florist & Gift Shop and head over to Krooked House for a scrumptious lunch. Stop at the Mile Zero Marker for a photo-op before heading home.

Friday July 22nd - It's the Bee's Knees

Visit the Town of Falher, home to the World's Largest Bee. Don't miss out on the 30 foot high Honey Capital Slide that you have to see to believe! Check out the shops around town including the Simard Butcher Shop which boasts a variety of fresh, smoked, cured and other beef and pork options. On the way home stop in to experience all the buzz about the Valley Bee Café. Last stop will be Smoky Gardens at Watino.

Friday July 29th - A Ferry Fun-Time in Peace River

All aboard the Shaftesbury Ferry to cross the river and head into the lovely Town of Peace River. Once there, enjoy the gorgeous Riverfront Park that boasts a large wooden statue of the famous 12 Foot Davis. Learn more about the history of Peace River by visiting the Peace River Museum Archives and Mackenzie Centre, conveniently located down a paved walking path a short distance from the Park. The bus will also be taking riders up Judah Hill to experience the breathtaking views from the Sagitawa Lookout.

Friday August 5th - A Sweet Date with all Things Historical

Head down to the beautiful Historic Dunvegan Provincial Park located on the banks of the Peace River. Visit the Interpretive Centre to learn more about the rich history of Dunvegan, play a round of mini-golf, enjoy an ice cream and visit the market gardens for a fun-filled day!

Friday August 12th - Muskoseepi Park, Fun for the Whole Family!

Enjoy all that picturesque Muskoseepi Park has to offer. Bring the kiddos to the splash park, playground, basketball courts and more! The variety of amenities are what makes this park fun for the whole family. The Grande Prairie Museum is located in the park as well. Learn about the pioneer past of the area, enjoy a round of mini-golf and indulge in an ice-cream. Please note that as we have a 16-passenger bus, the seats fill fast when booking for families.
